


Mid-term Evaluation Comments

- Good comments, bad comments, how to evaluate?
- Conflicting comments on content, presentation, or process
- There may be just one comment on an issue, either positive or negative
- Everyone has a different perspective, opinion, and level of understanding
- ▶ Not everyone is "right" due to emphasis, misunderstandings, bias, and subjectivity
- Some evaluators may pick up on a specific detail, not on your major point, so emphasize major points on a separate slide
- Make you own honest judgment on comments that could be helpful
- Same goes for your mid-term report markup






