BASIC CONCEPTS


- Offensive rebounds are good

EVALUATING OUR STATS

Offensive rebounds per missed shot * # of shots
* 2nd chance points * overall FG average

Allowed fast-break points per missed shot *
 Opponent defensive rebounds per 100
 possessions * # of shots

O-Rebounds (pms) = 10.07 Fast-break points allowed (pms) = 12.15 Offensive rebounds (pms) = 13.5 Fast-break points allowed (pms) = 13.23 Do teams with a higher number of offensive rebounds (per miss) allow more points in transition (per miss)?
