The State of Wyoming presents the following Status Report No. 9 pursuant to Section VII.D. of Case Management Plan No.1:

- 1. On September 17 and 18, 2012, Wyoming inspected the records of Art Hayes, Jr., president of Tongue River Water Users' Association. Wyoming provided copies of the documents it retained as a result of the inspection to Montana and North Dakota on October 3, 2012.
- 2. On August 7, 2012, the State of Montana asked the State of Wyoming to determine the availability of Mike Whitaker, Carmine LoGuidice, Jeff Fassett, Loren Smith, Pat Boyd, and Bill Knapp for depositions after the conclusion of the discovery moratorium. On August 23, 2012, in conformity with the Case Management Orders entered in this case, Wyoming requested that Montana provide an estimate of the time needed with each witness to facilitate scheduling. On August 29, 2012, Montana indicated that it would consider the issue and respond after the completion of the trial in the Republican River case.
- 3. On September 18, 2012, Wyoming again requested that Montana provide an estimate of the time needed to depose each of the six witnesses Montana had identified. Concurrently, Wyoming requested that Montana ascertain the availability of and begin to schedule the depositions of Mary Sexton, John Wheaton, Tim Davis, John Tubbs, Russ Levens, Kevin Smith, Glen McDonald, Christine Smith, Jim Robinson, Dan Buffalo (Ashenberg), Charles Gebhart, Charles Kepper, Art Hayes, Herb Mobley, Roger Muggli, Twila Jo Talcot, Glen Gay, Jim Bauder, Mark Fix, Rex Mongold, Allen Fjell,

Terry McLaughlin, and Chuck Dalby. To date no additional depositions have been scheduled in this matter.

4. On September 18, 2012, Wyoming served its Second Set of Interrogatories to Montana and its First Request for Admissions on Montana.
