

## Requirements for Listing Theme Houses, Focus Houses, or Co-Ops on Draw Applications

### Ethnic Theme Houses: No Requirements other than familiarity with the theme

#### Focus Houses: Focus houses have space for both focus and non-focus students

To apply for the focus side of the House choose the house name with (focus) behind it (i.e. Branner (focus))

Location	Focus	Requirements for Housing Draw and House Requirements
Adelfa	Writing	Familiarity with house theme and willingness to participate in house related programming
Branner	Public Service	Familiarity with house theme and willingness to participate in house related programming
Kimball	Performing Arts	Familiarity with house theme and willingness to participate in house related programming
Murray	Comparative Studies in Race and Ethnicity	Familiarity with house theme and willingness to participate in house related programming

### Academic Theme Houses

Note: Pre-requisites for living in the house are familiarity with house theme and willingness to participate in house related programming

Location	Theme	Requirements While Living in the House
East	East Asian Studies	Attend three theme-related events each quarter and be supportive of the theme. Pay board bill and work about one hour per week on hashing and other housekeeping duties.
Haus Mitteleuropa	Central European Theme House	Purchase house meal plan and perform weekly hashing duties as well as a quarterly Sunday clean. Attend eight Haus Mitt classes or other theme activities each quarter of residence. Complete a theme project if living in the house for more than one quarter. (A theme project is an individual group project on some topic related to German culture, language, history, etc. This can be done with fellow housemates)
La Maison Francaise	French Language and Culture	Agree to complete at least one unit of "theme classes" per quarter of residency. This can be satisfied by taking classes offered by the Department of French and Italian listed as FRENLANG, FRENLIT, or FRENGEN. In-house seminars also count toward this requirement. All residents must also complete one theme project to be presented to the house residents and must attend more than half of the quarterly scheduled theme presentations.
La Casa Italiana	Italian Language and Culture	Encouraged to have completed one year of college-level Italian coursework but language proficiency is not a requirement. Must enroll and complete house seminar (Fall plus one other quarter), attend more than half of the quarterly-scheduled theme events and complete two theme projects. Any resident who fails to meet these commitments will be subject to removal from the house and will not be allowed to live in the house again. Agree to pay a board bill and work each week on hashing and other housekeeping chores.
Slavianskii Dom	Slavic/East European Theme House	Complete all theme requirements for each quarter of residency that can be satisfied by taking classes, attending in-house seminars, and organizing presentations. All residents must complete one theme project to be presented to the house residents and must attend more than half of the quarterly scheduled theme presentations. In addition, all residents agree to pay a board bill and work each week hashing and performing other housekeeping chores.
Storey	Human Biology Theme House	Agree to attend two minor and one major theme event each quarter. Provide a 250 word essay for each event attended. Give a 10-15 minute presentation in Autumn or Winter quarter on a Hum Bio related interest and must take the one-unit Spring Quarter student initiated course (SIC) taught by the ATA's
Yost	Spanish Language and Culture	Must take a minimum of one credit unit of Spanish during the year you live in Yost. You can achieve this by taking either one of the activity courses in Yost or a class offered through the Language Center (SPAN/LANG) or the Spanish Department (SPANLIT). Residents also must complete one theme project to be presented to the house residents and attend more than half of the quarterly scheduled theme presentations.

## Co-Operative Houses

Note: Cooperative living houses ask residents to do about 4-5 hours of work every week. This work usually entails cooking and cleaning as needed by the house, and students can perform a different job every week. Jobs include everything from cooking dinner to cleaning the kitchen and from vacuuming to gardening. Residents working together to complete house jobs quickly give the house a strong sense of community. Synergy and Columbae are strictly vegetarian houses while Hammarskjold, Terra, EBF, Kairos, and Chi Theta Chi enjoy all kinds of cuisine. Dinners are usually served Sunday-Thursday. Breakfast, lunch, and midnight snacks are up to the individual, but the kitchens are fully stocked and residents often cook and socialize informally during the day.

<b>Chi Theta Chi</b>	<p>All residents are expected to complete the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Complete work week before school starts in Fall</li> <li>• Complete a work weekend for Winter and Spring quarter</li> <li>• Complete a weekly House job</li> <li>• Complete a weekly Kitchen job</li> </ul>
<b>Columbae</b>	<p>All residents are expected to complete the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Complete a weekly job</li> <li>• Complete a biweekly job</li> <li>• Complete an end of quarter job</li> <li>• Must be willing to switch rooms every quarter</li> <li>• Assist with decisions about house policies by consensus</li> <li>• Respect the vegetarian kitchen</li> </ul>
<b>Enchanted Broccoli Forest</b>	<p>All residents are expected to complete the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Complete a weekly job</li> <li>• Complete 3 quarterly jobs</li> <li>• Complete 3 bathroom cleans</li> </ul>
<b>Hammarskjold</b>	<p>All residents are expected to complete the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Complete a weekly job</li> <li>• Complete a biweekly job</li> <li>• Hold at least one cultural/international theme event for the house during the course of the year.</li> </ul>
<b>Kairos</b>	<p>All residents are expected to complete the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Attend in house draw (or have designated proxy)</li> <li>• Complete 3 Cooking shifts each quarter with vegetarian options required</li> <li>• Complete 5 bathroom cleans</li> <li>• Complete weekly Dinner or Lunch hashes</li> <li>• Complete 2 quarterly jobs</li> <li>• Assist with the end of the quarter clean</li> <li>• Participate in the House's Social Events, particularly the biweekly gatherings</li> </ul>
<b>Synergy</b>	<p>All residents are expected to complete the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Participate in the house's consensus decision-making process, and abide by all consensus decisions</li> <li>• Clean up after yourself at all times</li> <li>• Complete a weekly job</li> <li>• Complete 5 quarterly jobs             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Bathroom Clean</li> <li>2. House Clean</li> <li>3. Kitchen Clean</li> <li>4. End-of-Quarter Clean</li> <li>5. Head Cook</li> </ol> </li> </ul>
<b>Terra</b>	<p>All residents are expected to complete the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Complete a weekly job</li> <li>• Complete 3 bathroom cleans each quarter</li> <li>• Complete 3 quarterly jobs</li> <li>• Assist with the end of the quarter clean</li> <li>• Assist with opening and closing of the house</li> <li>• Participate in the house's social events, assisting with setup and cleanup</li> </ul>
