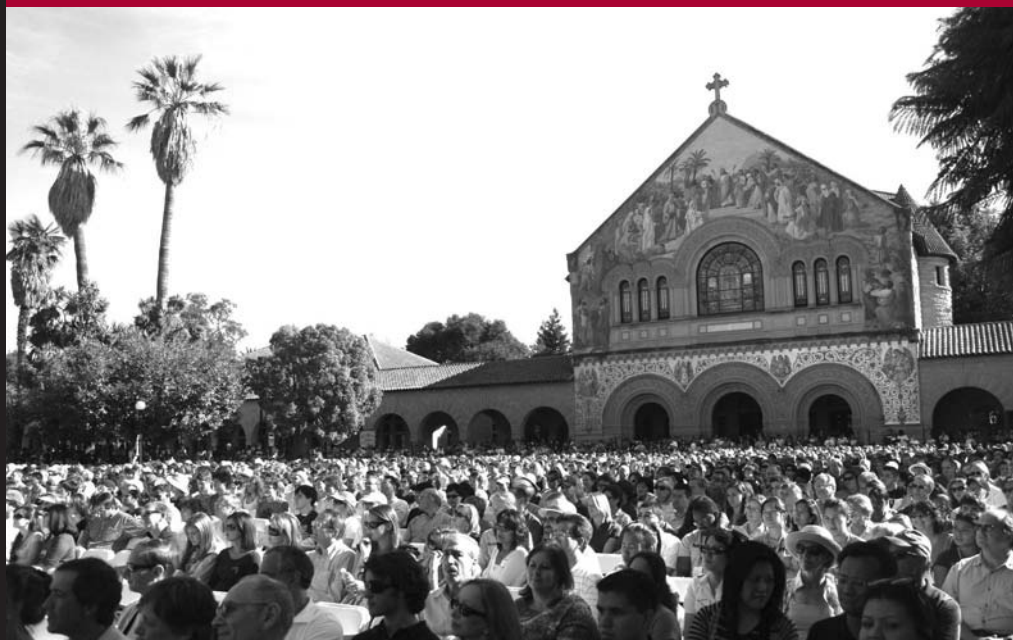

Parking on Campus

After unloading your car at the dorm, please move your vehicle as quickly as possible to the parking lot at Galvez Field, located west of Stanford Stadium. Ample free parking is available at Galvez Field, which is close to the Arrillaga Center for Sports and Recreation – where many parents will end their day at the Parent Dinner. Stanford's "Marguerite" shuttle busses will take you from Galvez Field back to the residence halls until 7:00 p.m. Look for the marked shuttle stop in front of Galvez Field.

Getting Around Campus

Should you wish to visit academic departments or other offices on campus, they are generally open 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. and 1:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m. All locations are wheelchair accessible unless otherwise noted on the map. Parent Dinner with the Provost

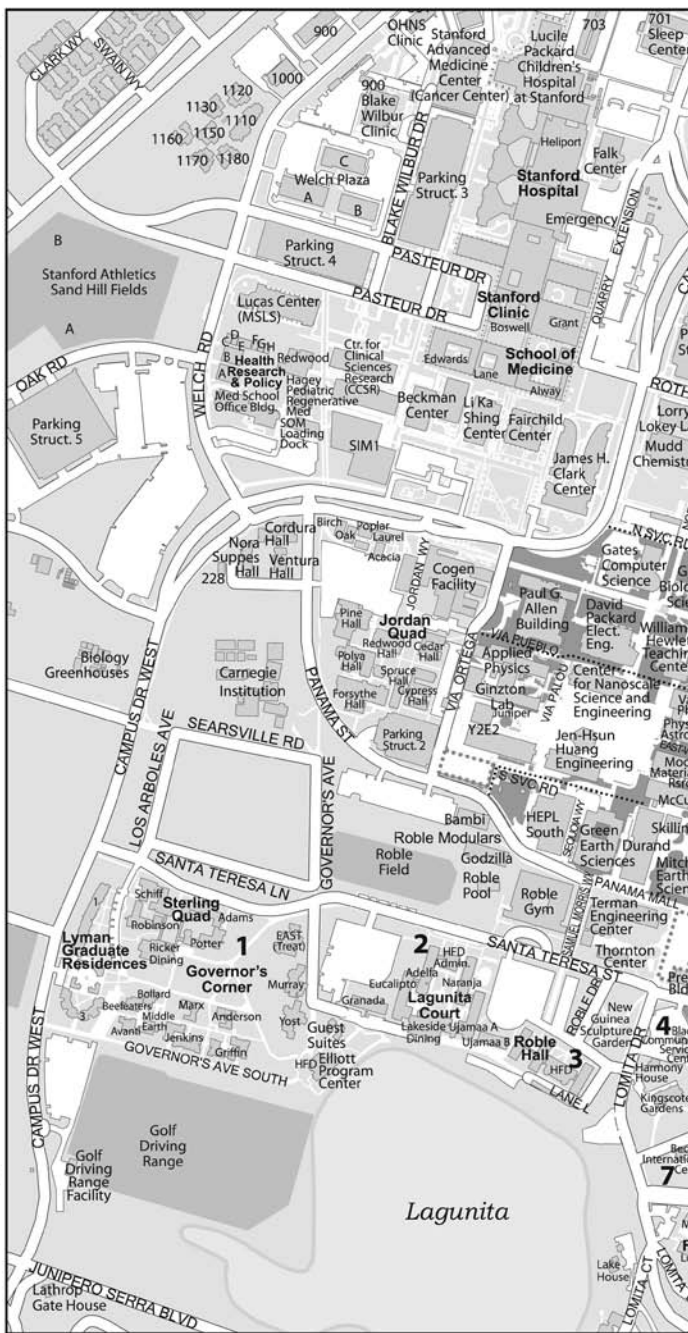

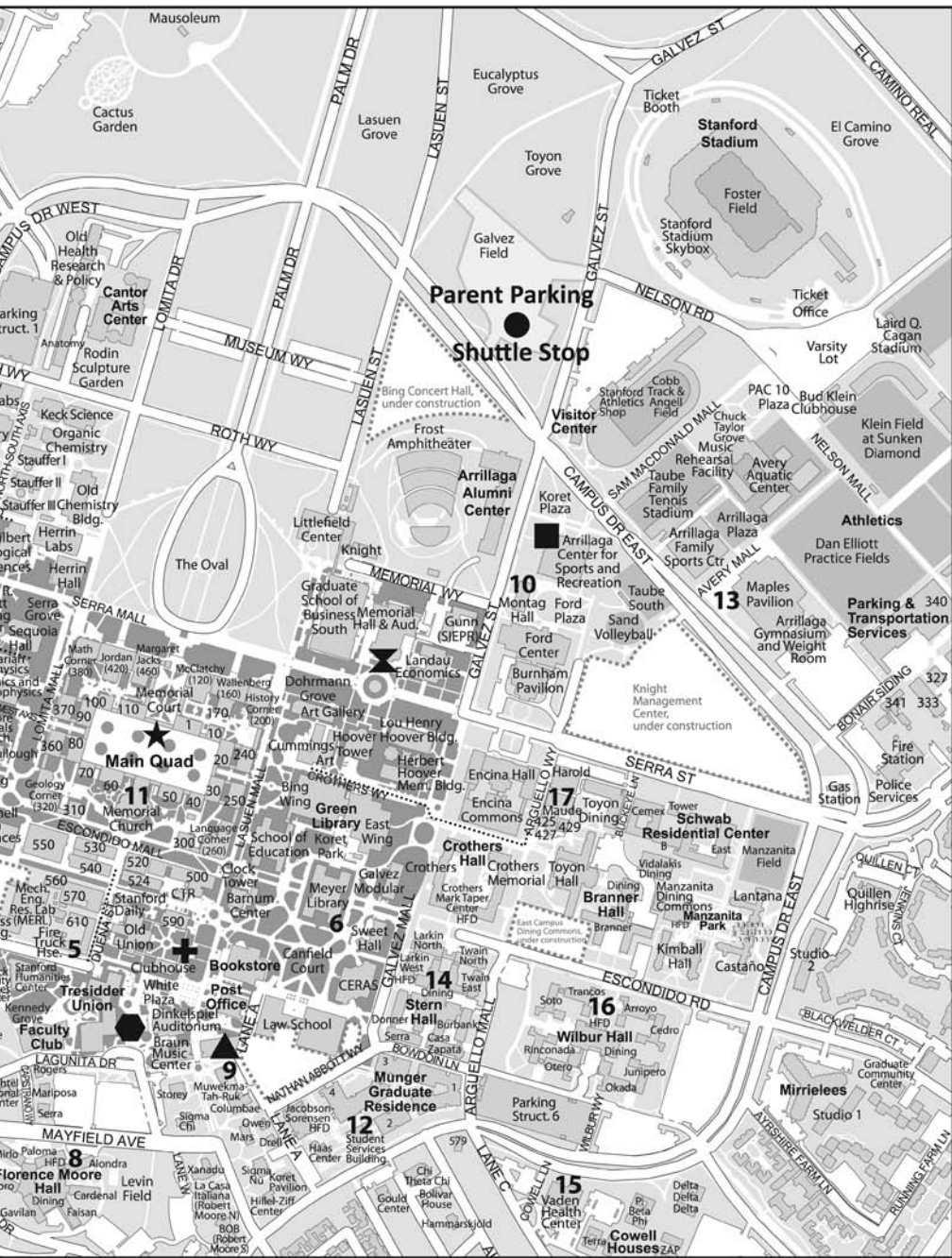
Orientation Campus Map

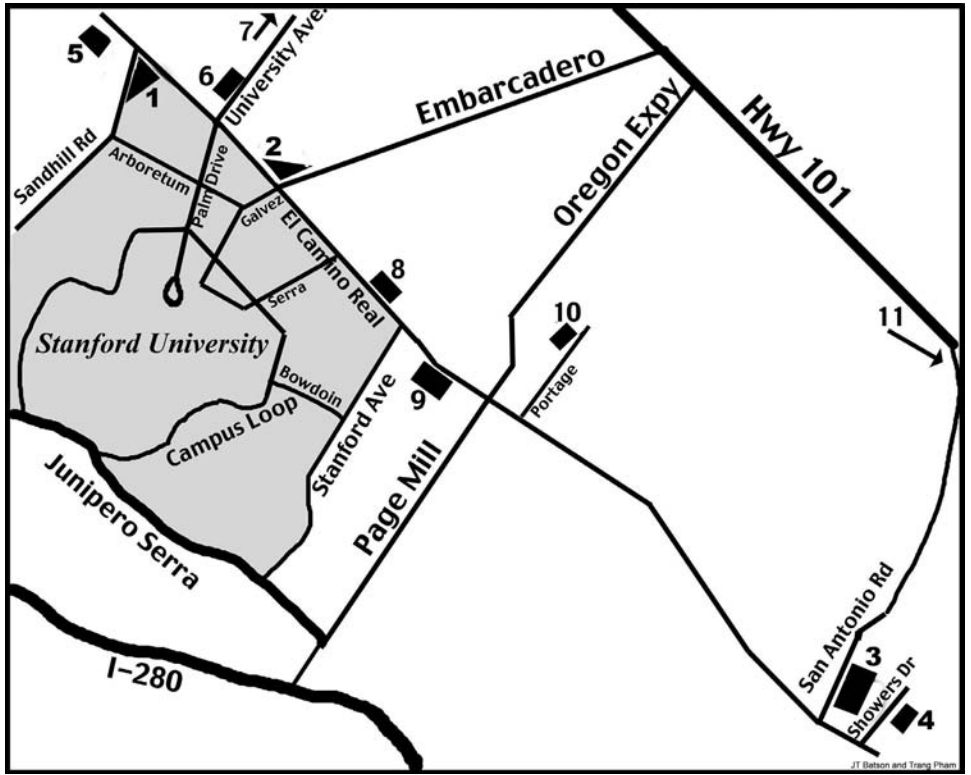
