

More on the tag...

src="URL" (required)

URL is the location of the image file

height="XX"

Height in pixels of the image file

width="YY"

Width in pixels of the image file

border="ZZ"

Size of the border, in pixels (select 0 if you don't want a border)

align="left/right/top/middle/bottom"

Alignment of the image in relationship to the surrounding text

alt="text"

Alternative text which is displayed if the browser cannot process the image.

Text appears as a tooltip in most Windows-based browsers (but not Macintosh).

title="text"

Title of image. Text appears as a tooltip in most browsers, including on a Mac.

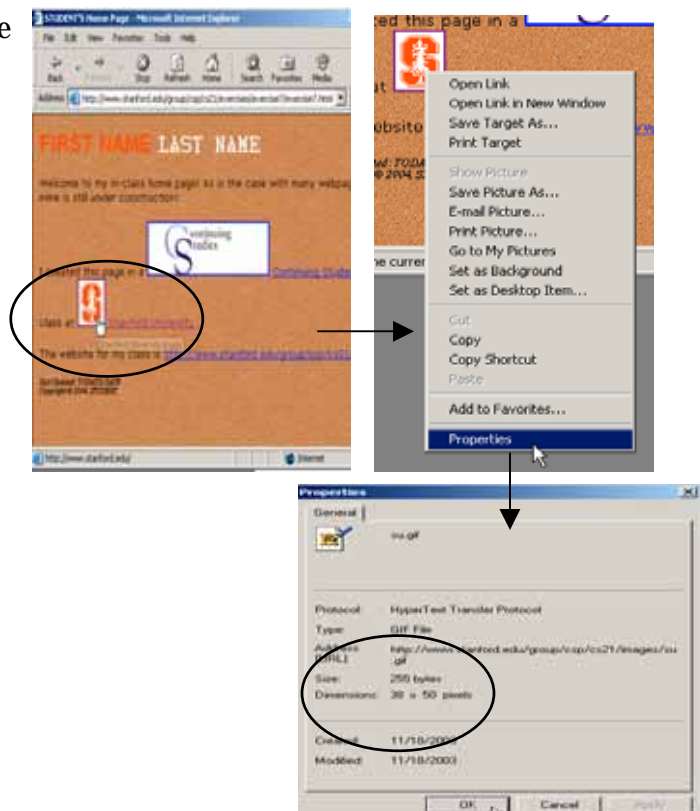
So, a complete tag might look like:

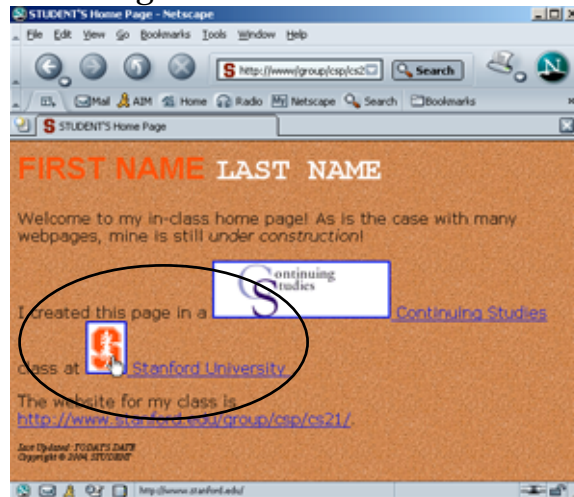
To find the width & height of an image (Internet Explorer for Windows):

1. Launch Internet Explorer and locate the website that has the image
2. Place the mouse over the image and right-click.
3. A dialog box will appear. Select "Properties".
4. Look at **Dimensions**:
Your image will be listed in pixels (Width x Height)

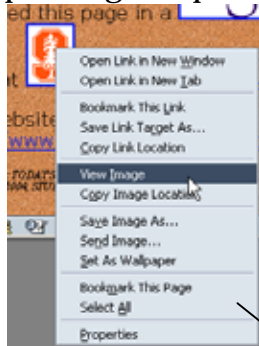


To find the width & height of an image (Netscape, Internet Explorer for Macintosh, Safari):

1. Launch Netscape/IE for Mac/Safari and locate the website that has the image.
2. Place the mouse over the image.



3. On a PC, right-click. On a Macintosh, control-click. A dialog box will appear. Select "View Image" or "Open Image" or "Open Image in New Window" (depending on operating system and browser).



4. Look in the title bar. The image size should be displayed in pixels: Width x Height
