

wireless pocket telephone (PT)

- Works directly with the Stanford phone system
- Offers the same features as your desk phone
- Provides for secure conversations
- Designed specifically for use in hospital environments

WHAT IS THE PT? The Wireless Pocket Telephone (PT) is a wireless phone designed for use in the Stanford Hospital, Lucile Packard Children's Hospital, clinics, and many parts of the School of Medicine. Functioning as a "mobile desk phone," the PT works directly with the Stanford's own telephone system. Dialing and features on the PT work much the same as a desktop Stanford telephone but offer the added benefit of mobility in placing and receiving calls. The base stations (ceiling-mounted antennas) let you use your PT throughout the Hospital/Medical Center complex.

WHY SHOULD I USE IT? Use of ordinary cell phones is disallowed in many areas throughout the Medical Center, as cell phones can interfere with sensitive medical equipment such as pacemakers and medical telemetry. Designed specifically for use in hospital environments, the PT operates at lower power levels that do not interfere with this equipment. But it's more than just a replacement for a cell phone. The PT:

- *Integrates your desk phone with your mobile phone*— You can be fully mobile throughout most of the Hospital/Medical Center complex while remaining reachable via your usual telephone number. And, you can use your PT in the same way you're accustomed to using your desk phone, with 5-digit dialing, voice mail integration, and features you've subscribed to on your desk phone, including:
 - call forward
 - speed calling (up to 10 numbers)
 - calling name/number delivery blocking
 - call park store/retrieve
 - transfer
 - 3-way conference
 - last number redial
 - use of your usual authorization code
- *Provides security*— Superior to cordless phone systems, the PT provides for secure conversations by means of state-of-the-art technology and digital encoding.
- *Covers roaming throughout the Hospital/Medical Center complex*— The PT system covers the Stanford Hospital; Packard Hospital; attached buildings in the Medical Center Central Core; East Pavilion; B, C, D, E, F pods; Boswell; Grant; Edwards; Alway (Science); Clark Center; Cancer Center; LPCH Clinics (730 Welch); Lane Library; and Jordan Quad.
- *Is easy to use*— The PT's lightweight ergonomic handset makes it easy to use. It's also headset-compatible, for hands-free use.
