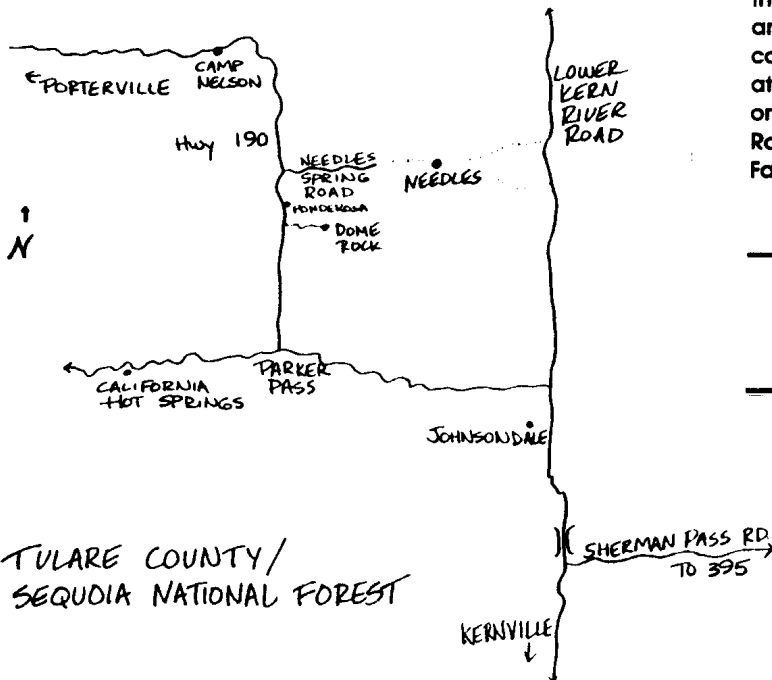


Being in Sequoia National Forest, camping is unrestricted. Along the lower Kern River road, there are innumerable spots to turn off and camp. The lower Peppermint campground is located a couple of miles from Voodoo Dome, and a primitive camp exists at Needlerock Creek. There are three Forest Service campgrounds on Highway 190. Camping is also popular on the roads into Dome Rock, the Needles, and the 2 1/2 mile road into the Penny Pines Tree Farm, where outstanding views of the Needles may be had.
