

The prize recognized Prof. Shirane's role in deepening the understanding of Japanese culture in a global context. Koizumi Prize David W. Hughes (IUC '70), formerly Lecturer in Ethnomusicology of the Department of Music at SOAS University of London for over two decades and currently a Research Associate at the SOAS Japan Research Centre, was awarded the Koizumi Fumio Prize for Ethnomusicology for 2018. The award, named for Japan's first great ethnomusicologist, acknowledges Prof. Hughes's "long-term contribution to ethnomusicology in research and education, with emphasis on Japanese folk music in theory and practice." In

Barak Kushner (IUC '95), Professor of East Asian History at the University of Cambridge, received the 15th Nakasone Yasuhiro Award in June for his research on a wide range of subjects surrounding Japanese history and culture including such subjects as comparing how the war and postwar have been perceived both within Japan and in East Asia, examining Japanese food culture (especially of ramen) and how it links modern Japanese history to the Chinese continent, and the evolution of imperial Japanese
